Well it finally cooled off but after an unusually warm December where 28 out of 31 days were above normal in temperature, the association operating budget ended the calendar year in great financial shape primarily due to low energy usage. Surely this may be the only December in history the staff was able to plant trees and shrubs and have it rain 5 times before the snow arrived.

The great weather allowed for a tremendous amount of fall cleanup and a great jump for the staff going into the real winter months of January and February. It was the first fall where we had to empty the ponds a second time in December due to the large amount of rain we received after the ponds closed in October.

The condominiums have an unusual agreement with the City of Madison to pick up our trash and yard waste at our private collection point (within the City's easement) just north of the Cherokee Country Club entrance on Sherman Ave. This is a terrific solution to what would be an immense hauling operation to the City dumpsite. We physically do not have enough curb space to handle the acreage of property we maintain. If we brought the leaves and trimmings to the curb like homeowners do, it would constantly be hundreds of yards long and be extremely unsightly.

Our only problem with the yard waste area is illegal dumping. Please help us monitor this area at all times by taking a license number or description of vehicles and notify our office if you see someone other than our staff placing materials in that location. We are getting a few outsiders who dump their old TV sets, old tires, and other difficult to dispose of junk in this location. We tidy up behind them but it would be of great assistance if we could catch them in the act and let the authorities pay them a visit.

City Trash Vehicle Change Leads to Slower Collection Times

If we identify owners who are not following instructions we will notify them directly whenever possible or return their improperly packaged materials.

During the winter months plumbing drains can evaporate causing sewer gas to enter your home. Add a quart of water to all your drains that are not used regularly to avoid evaporation. It is always good to exercise you faucets too. The guest shower that is never used will benefit by opening and closing the faucet every so often to avoid corrosion from damaging the internal components of the faucet.

Dear Residents,

With only half the normal amount of snow to date, we are able to work on more productive projects this winter. In addition to the normal projects the association staff handles in the wintertime, we are really focusing on getting the garage areas squared away, cleaned and painted where needed. Storage in the garages is limited to vehicles and bikes, with a few exceptions. The majority of the storage issues are in the earlier buildings that have smaller storage lockers in the garage level. I really appreciate everyone's cooperation helping the staff by putting the loose items away promptly. This allows the staff to pressure wash the walls and really get the buildings clean. The rules outline exactly what can be placed in the garages.

Several buildings are in the process of doing some minor hallway updating. Building owners wanting to have carpet replaced or to have wallpaper removed, can meet with the Building Resource Committee and discuss their options. Some of the hallway redecorating costs are charged back to the unit owners in the individual buildings. The association pays for most of the painting, but the owners are responsible for the cost of carpet replacement and wallpaper removal or replacement.

Sometimes getting everyone to agree on a material selection is easy, sometimes not. The committee helps steer owners and advise them with their selections. We are working on updating a few policies related to the process of helping owners with selecting colors and materials that will help owners with the process. Remember the hallways are a shared space and nothing can be nailed up, adorned or placed in the hallways without the agreement of at least 50% of the owners and the resource committee. In the case of storage, nothing can ever be stored in the hallways at any time. Everyone's taste is different so decorations are by far the hardest thing to agree on, so less is usually better than more. The freshly updated hallways look great and add value, it is great to see these projects moving

Tip Of the Month!In most of our buildings the bathroom electrical outlets and porch outlets are interconnected and are protected by a ground fault circuit. If you ever lose power in your bathroom outlets, or porch outlets, unplug everything in both bathrooms and on your porch and press the small reset button on the face of one of your bathroom GFCI outlets. On the image there are two buttons on the front of this outlet, one is labeled as a test button and one is a reset button. Normally pressing the reset button will reset the circuit and restore your power. If not, give us a call at 241-4747.



Dear Residents,

Winter is almost over! Thanks to our below average winter weather we are ahead of budget and it looks like we will stay that way. Normally the extreme cold weather months of January and February dictate the ending fund balance in the heating budget, which is our single largest building cost.

Water usage remains stable and with more and more new efficient toilets going in, the water usage is trending slightly downward. Keep in mind original toilets installed before 1991 use 3.6 gallons per flush. New toilets are between 1.28 and 1.6 gallons per flush and actually flush better than the old models. Did you know there are rebates from the City of Madison in the amount of \$100 for replacing a toilet? The rebate helps offset the replacement cost. (This rebate is only for the 1.28 gallon per flush models.) Several owners have chosen the comfort height toilets that are "chair height" and they have been very happy with the upgrade, plus everyone benefits from the water savings!

All owners should be aware the Board has recently expanded the no smoking rules a bit to help owners who want to avoid second hand smoke near the public entrances of the buildings. The new rule prohibits smoking within 25 feet of any public entrance to the building. Please advise guests of this new rule. Smoking has for decades been prohibited in the garages and common hallways. Now in 2016 the no smoking rule extends the ban for smoking in common areas a distance of 25 feet from each "public entrance door", which means the front door/s and garage doors.

A few buildings have taken the no smoking policy a bit further than the rest of the association. There are three buildings that have chosen to collectively agree to not smoke anywhere within their building, including inside their units on a voluntary basis. This is an agreement among owners and is not an enforceable association rule. The building owners

require 100% of units to agree to make this effective. Then with Board approval a sign is then placed in the entrance of the building, (at the individual building's expense), that states: "Attention: This is a Smoke Free Building". There is a growing concern about the known health issues related to second hand smoke and owners are beginning to take steps to limit their exposure. Hope you all have a great month,

Weather has been fairly mild this year other than a furious 2.5" snowfall that amounted to nothing on April 2nd, we have enjoyed a great winter and now a slowly warming spring. The budget is on track and we dodged a polar vortex which is always nice! The recent spring winds have pointed out numerous roof nearing the end of their useful lives. The sealants on the shingle tabs in time can lose their grip causing some shingles to blow off in the wind. Also, 20 years in the sunlight alone start to deteriorate the shingles. It is our job to try to find the balance between maximum shingle life and the avoidance of roof leaks. So as we go through each roof we are beginning to develop a list of roofs that will need replacement in the next several years. (None this summer). Each owner will be notified a year or more in advance. Roof replacements are specific to each building and are assessed according to the square footage of each unit in the building getting the new roof. This advanced notice allows for financial planning in the event your roof needs to be replaced.

It is now the very beginning of the planting season. We really appreciate the beautiful plantings throughout the development. Now is a good time to remind owners that you need to exercise good judgment about what you do in the common areas relating to planting or placing anything outside. There are certainly hundreds of different things that should not be placed outside. Please, no ornaments, lights, fences, tools, grills, dog tie outs, vegetables, ground level feeders, plastic edging or any patio block arrangements covering an area larger than 4'x6'. "When in doubt, don't set it out." We really do not enjoy telling owners they need to return their expensive purchases. Personal decorations are for inside your unit, not outside. Thank you in advance for your cooperation! Hope you all have a great month,



Thank you for your support and record turnout for the annual meeting. When the dust cleared, we had 370 units in person or by proxy in attendance at the Cherokee Garden Condominium Association's 40th Annual Meeting.

Some of the things we talked about was the road agreement for Golf Parkway. Now that development is done on Golf Parkway we are working out an agreement with the neighboring Townhouse Association and the Golf View Condominiums on Golf Parkway. The agreement will outline the various areas of responsibility for three associations.

We fixed a few small boulder walls by building 15 and 20. A large retaining wall is being removed and rebuilt at building 9. This wall will be a gravity wall-similar to the pool area but with a more natural stone design. The same contractor OLP Inc. will be doing the work, so we know it will turn out great!

Porch repairs are underway at building 15 on a few units that were designed with suspension supports, which are being replaced with a more sturdy, permanent I-beam design.

Dear Residents,

We have had a great summer so far. Plenty of rain to help the lawns and many beautiful days to go to the pools. The crew is working hard on summer planting, mulching, fence mending, and as always lots and lots of mowing.

I have received numerous questions on what is being done north of our development. Many of you have seen the North Sherman Avenue construction project just north of Golf Parkway and Cherokee Country Club. This project is being done by Cherokee Park Inc, (CPI). CPI plans to develop a new section of single family home lots along the east side of the Golf Course. The first part of the project involves extending the city's water mains and storm sewers and creating a detention pond on the Golf Course to capture storm water. The detention pond will help keep the marsh cleaner by providing a place for the sediment from Sherman Avenue and our development to settle out before getting into the marsh.

CPI is selling lots on the east side of Sherman Avenue along the golf course. A new road will be built extending west off of Sherman Avenue towards the Golf Course just past the entrance of the Country Club. The 15 new lots will not be part of a condominium, they will be zero-lot line single family homes in the City of Madison. Any actual building construction will begin sometime after October 15th.

The work being done now is being done by the City of Madison to extend the water mains, sewer system, and other underground utilities. This required many trees to be removed and a fleet of large equipment to trench their way along the roadway. Please avoid this area if possible until the large equipment clears out, it is a dangerous work zone. When the underground work is finished a sidewalk will extended a few hundred yards further down Sherman Ave. along with curb, gutter and new pavement to the end of the work zone.

Our roads will be open during the entire project so there should not be any access problems for our owners or maintenance department staff. The pavement at the entrance of Golf Parkway, and a storm sewer installation may cause some minor delays during work hours so plan accordingly.

If you have any specific questions or inquiries on the lots, construction or other details relating to this project they should be directed to the Cherokee Park Inc. sales office by calling 249-1000.

The new construction project will relocate our yard waste area but CPI is working with us to create a new location.

Dear Residents.

Fall is a transition season for the association. Pools close soon, and heat will be turned on soon as well. The maintenance department has several 30 year plus employees that know when the heat needs to be on, so we watch weather closely and fire up the boilers accordingly.

Normally, boilers get turned on around September 15th and run constantly through the end of May. The boilers have a warm weather shut down feature, meaning if it gets warm enough outside they automatically go idle until it is cool enough to start up. The boilers are programmed this way to save energy costs. If you have a furnace of your own it is a good idea to service the furnace at the beginning of the heating season, versus waiting until winter when contractors are busy with service calls. A clean furnace saves you money right away and helps you avoid unexpected breakdowns and expenses.

If you travel away from Madison for the winter, it is especially important that you keep your furnace in tip-top condition. Another thing to watch out for are digital thermostats. While they are nice for controlling airconditioning, they can fail suddenly, shutting off your furnace or our boiler heat. Most digital thermostats have one or two-AA batteries that require annual replacement! If the batteries fail during cold weather, your furnace could shut off when you are away, and potentially cause pipes to freeze. I recommend replacing the batteries at the beginning of the heating season for insurance purposes. Do this at the same time you are replacing your smoke detector and co-detector batteries.

The whole crew is really working hard to keep the grounds in beautiful condition.

We will sure miss our great summer staff, they are all heading back to school this week. I hope you had a chance to interact with a few the great young men working for us this summer. They really worked hard and did a great job. Also, thank you to all the flower gardeners that plant the multitude of beautiful flowers each year, the flowers really add to our already beautiful landscaping.

Wil's Maintenance Tip of the Month!

Fall is a good time to replace your smoke detector batteries. Buy lithium batteries, they should last much longer than typical alkaline. The some detectors on the ceilings have a 10 year battery that is non-serviceable so you should only need batteries for the "wall mounted" smoke detectors.

The eye level detector is a carbon monoxide detector that takes 3-AA batteries. Change wall mounted detector batteries annually, or use the high quality lithium batteries for extra long life.

Dear Residents,

The heat has been on and off a number of times this fall. Normally, we turn on the heat around mid-September and it is on continuously until late May. It has been a fairly warm start so far, but it is changing quickly. We now have the heat turned on everywhere. If you have any heating problems please contact the maintenance department at 241-4747 for assistance. Normally, the heating systems are very reliable. However occasionally a valve called the "zone valve" can fail either in the open position or closed position, causing either too much or too little heat in your unit. The hot water boilers have sensors that adjust the water temperature based on outdoor air temperature. If it is too warm outside they will automatically shut the boiler down to save energy. When outdoor temperatures dip, the boiler water temperature increases automatically to keep up with the falling temperatures. This type of system saves energy by automatically regulating the water temperature throughout the day.

One indication of the system being turned on is "sound". Some minor noises are unavoidable and subside in a few seconds. However, occasionally when your heat comes on the hot water running through your pipes causes the pipes to expand creating loud ticking sounds. Many times loud expansion noise can be stopped by simply adjusting the metal cover on your baseboards or moving the heating pipe slightly in it's bracket.

Other sounds can include a loud gurgling sound, sounding just like a babbling brook. This indicates air is in the heating lines and needs to be bled out of the system or low pressure. This is a job for our maintenance department staff. Also, if your pipes make a loud banging sound this could indicate other problems and this too should be inspected by our maintenance crew. Remember, if you don't inform us of these problems we likely will not be aware you are having issues because the sounds are primarily inside the individual units.

Good progress is being made on the road and storm water improvements on North Sherman Avenue. The road disruption has been more of a hindrance for the maintenance department than our owners but it is nice to see the main part of the project is nearing completion. The contractors have indicated Golf Parkway should remain open even during asphalt paving but allow yourself a bit more time over the next few weeks in case of short delays.

With another warm start to fall we are heading into the winter in good financial shape. Heating costs are down, and water costs are down due to the abundance of rain. The changes in weather have not been easy on the awnings and roofs, keeping them constantly wet is not ideal. We are sending out roof replacement notices soon for a number of buildings. We try to give over a year's notice so 2018 will begin a number of roof replacements in the newer buildings, and in second roofs in some of the older buildings. Each unit owner will get a notice of approximate roof replacement schedules over the next few weeks.

Owners, it is also time to put your own outdoor items away for the winter. Storage of flower pots, metal hooks, hoses, tools or other items must be put away now. Remember porches are not allowed to be used for storage items either. Porches are designated limited common areas and are subject to association rules as it relates to storage and maintenance. All storage items need to either be placed in your unit or in your storage locker downstairs. Do not place items in your parking spaces either. To avoid getting a notice for improperly stored items, please take the time now to put these items in their proper location. If you plan to be gone for an extended period of time please always leave your phone number and your forwarding address with our business office by emailing cherokeegc@gmail.com or calling 244-8144. Our office keeps a list of away owners on file each year. Even if you are going back to the same address as last year, it is a good idea that you leave your contact information at our

office.

- Fish gravel
- Rags or towels

This pruning cycle begins in winter and we will work on this all the way through March of 2017.

If you have a holiday wreath to dispose of please throw it in the regular trash. The metal in the wreath can't go into the compost area. Reminder, don't drag Christmas trees through the hallways unless completely encased in a large Christmas tree plastic bag. Christmas trees are picked up weekly by the grounds crew as they make the rounds around the buildings. The benches are also put away to avoid damage from snow removal equipment.

Snow plowing season requires a lot of hard work for our dedicated staff to complete in a timely manner. Please always park in your vehicle indoors when the snow flies to allow our staff to fully clear off the parking lots and driveways. If you have guests parking outdoors please ask them to move threir car to a cleared area as soon as possible to allow our crew to remove snow and salt the pavement if needed to keep our driveways safe.
